Shopping Hours for Vulnerable Adults

Many stores are offering special hours and times reserved for vulnerable populations, which may include: older adults (60+ unless otherwise specified), pregnant women, individuals with disabilities, and individuals with compromised immunity. Please note that during Phase 2 of reopening, Vulnerable Adult shopping hours may be phased out as they are no longer actively advertised in many stores. Many stores may also be restricting the number of people allowed in the store at one time, therefore there may be a line outside of the store. Effective July 7th, businesses are required to enforce the use of face coverings by all customers or visitors (with exceptions for people with certain disabilities or health conditions, people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and children under the age of 2). For specifics, please contact your local store.

SAFeway/ALBERTSONS: All Clark County locations, Tuesdays and Thursdays 6 am - 9 am.

WINCO: All Clark County locations, Tuesdays and Thursdays 5 am – 7:30 am.

WALMART: All Clark County locations, Tuesdays from 6 am – 7 am. Pharmacies and Vision Centers will also be open during this time.

FRED MEYER: All Clark County locations, Tuesdays and Thursdays 6 am – 8 am.

COSTCO: All Clark County locations, Monday – Friday 8:30 am – 9:30 am. These hours are specifically for “members 60 and older and people with disabilities.” Guests will not be admitted. .

TARGET: considers seniors to be 65+

Vancouver Plaza: Tuesdays and Wednesday 8 am – 9 am. Including Pharmacy.

Hazel Dell Towne Center: Tuesday and Wednesday 7 am – 8 am. Including Pharmacy.

Mill Plain Town Center: Tuesday and Wednesday 7 am – 8 am. Including Pharmacy.

Hayden Island (Portland): Tuesday and Wednesday 8 am – 9 am. Including Pharmacy.

WALGREENS: All Clark County locations every Tuesday from 8:00 am – 9:00 am. Only for adults age 55 and over.

ADAPT PROGRAM AT PEACEHEALTH SOUTHWEST

The ADAPT day treatment program is now offering virtual support. People living with mental health symptoms can learn new ways to cope through daily online classes and professional support. People can participate in this program as initial access to the mental health system, or as a supplemental component to current mental health services. Dental

Other Assistance

FACE MASKS AND COVERINGS

The Washington State Department of Health issued a statewide face covering requirement effective June 26, 2020. Every person in Washington State must wear a face covering in any indoor public setting or when outdoors and unable to maintain 6 feet of physical distance from others. There are some exceptions to the requirement, including: people with certain disabilities or health conditions, people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and children under the age of 2. (Officials encourage use of a face covering by children ages 3-5 if possible. Children 5 and older must wear a face covering.)

Offers Clark County residents access to food banks, pharmacies, and grocery stores. Assistance includes coordinating a grocery pickup order, item pick up and deliveries, and taking individuals to the grocery store.

SENIOR WELLNESS CHECK – CLARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Volunteers with local law enforcement agencies are providing free phone calls to check on the safety of older residents and individuals with disabilities who live alone. Calls will be made at a pre-arranged time and frequency. Law enforcement officers will perform a wellness check after three unsuccessful contact attempts to the resident and unsuccessful contact of the emergency contact. VOLUNTEER SERVICES

No contact services includes shop/deliver groceries, prescriptions, and pet food using EBT and other forms of payments. Other assistance includes medical rides to essential appointments (chemo, dialysis, etc) and some yard care on a case-by-case basis.
