## **When can I get the COVID-19 vaccine?**

Vaccine supplies are low. The vaccine is offered in steps starting with those most at risk for COVID-19. See if you are eligible using the Washington's Phase Finder tool. Bring proof of your eligibility to your vaccine appointment. <https://form.findyourphasewa.org/210118771253954>

## **Where can I get the COVID-19 vaccine if I am eligible?**

There are many vaccine sites in Clark County. More will open soon. Many sites require you to schedule an appointment online. You can find a vaccine location using the link below:

## **What do I need to bring to my COVID-19 vaccine appointment?**

You must bring proof of [vaccine eligibility](#) **AND** show you live or work in Washington by:

- Driver's License or ID card
- Mail or bills with your name and address
- Letter from your church, doctor's office, or school to show you live or work in Washington.

NOTE: The vaccine site will **not** copy or record your address in any way.

## **How can I schedule a vaccine appointment if I do not use the internet?**

	Sign-up for the vaccine waiting list. A vaccine provider will contact you when an appointment is available. It may take weeks to receive a call. Call the Aging & Disability Resource Center to complete the online form for you. Call 360-694-8144

## **How much will it cost?**

The vaccine is free for everyone. You will not be charged any costs or receive a bill for the COVID-19 vaccine. The government pays the cost.

# WASHINGTON'S COVID-19 VACCINE PHASE ESTIMATES

## WINTER

**1A**

Tiers  
1&2

- High-risk healthcare workers in health care settings
- High-risk first responders
- Long-term care facility residents
- All other workers at risk in health care settings

**1B**

Tier 1

- All people **65 years or older**
- All people **50 years or older** in homes where people from 2 or more generations reside (such as an elder and a grandchild)

## SPRING/SUMMER

**1B**

Tier 2

- High-risk critical workers **50 years or older** who work in certain congregate settings (agriculture, food processing, grocery stores, K-12 schools, childcare, correctional facilities, public transit, fire, law enforcement)

**1B**

Tier 3

- People **16 years or older** with 2 or more co-morbidities or underlying conditions

**1B**

Tier 4

- High-risk critical workers **under 50 years** who work in certain congregate settings (noted in 1B Tier 2)
- People, staff, and volunteers in congregate living settings (correctional facilities, group homes for people with disabilities, people experiencing homelessness that live in or access services in congregate settings)
