When can I get vaccinated?

Vaccine supply is limited. The vaccine is being rolled out in phases starting with those most at risk for COVID-19 infection. You can see if you're eligible using Washington's Phase Finder tool. How much will it cost?

The vaccine is completely free for everyone. You will not be charged any out of pocket costs or receive a bill for the COVID-19 vaccine. All costs will be covered by the federal government.
